








#### **BOOK OF THE WEEK**

Klein, now in his seventies. takes a look at some of the ideas and aphorisms that once made sense. Now with age and perspective, that may change.






Each quotation chapter is just a few pages long so there is a breezy quality to the book. If you find yourself chuckling at the title alone, this may be a book for you."

Year 10 SEREN award pupils worked with a PhD student during three online sessions. Our pupils were tasked to write a university style report on the potential for SMART building technologies in schools.


















# **YOUNG CHAMBER**
