Well done to all our Year 7 students who have, so far, read a combined total of over 22.3 million words with the Accelerated Reader scheme during the school year.



Look for clues and objects from some of the most popular library books on classroom doors around the school. Match the clues with the book. Prizes for winners!






Book-inspired bake-off.
