Reporting absence:

When your child will be absent from school, we kindly request that you call the school office to report the absence with a brief explanation. Alternatively, please email your child's form tutor and copy in Mrs Williams who will amend the register accordingly.

Form time:

It is expected all students, regardless of their lessons for the day, attend form time with their tutor. Form time provides a valuable opportunity for form tutors to get to know students which will enable them to write personalised references for UCAS/apprenticeships in year 13.

Frequently asked questions:

What are A levels and how are they set up over the two-year course?

A full A level is comprised of AS (advanced subsidiary) and A2 (advanced level). In Wales, the AS year continues to be examined externally or through NEAs (Non-Examined Assessments) and will account for 40% of the overall A level.

The second year, A2, accounts for the remaining 60% of the qualification. The full A level is made up of the grades and scores achieved through the AS and A2 examinations and/or NEAs. The grades available are A-E at AS and A*-E for the full A level.

How many subjects do students study in 6th Form?

Most students take three A levels and the Advanced Skills Baccalaureate Wales qualification. Some students may elect to take four A levels with careful consideration given to their ability to manage the workload.

How do I know how subjects are assessed, what examinations there are and if my child has coursework in their qualification?

At the end of this booklet is a useful timeline of all subjects delivered at A level. There are details as to the weighting of each unit, whether there are NEAs to complete and rough timelines for when these are due to be completed. We have also included as an indication when we will set trial examinations in school to measure the progress of your child.

How will I know what progress my child is making?

Throughout the two years teachers will formally assess student's progress and communicate this to parents/carers through the grade cards. You will receive an indication of your child's aspirational target grade, their current performance from the most recent assessment point, their working towards grade and their attitude to learning. You will receive these grade cards in early November, early February and early April. Please do contact teachers if you have any queries or concerns following receipt of your child's grade card.

Does my child automatically enter year 13 after completing year 12?

Provided your child achieves a grade A-E in their overall AS qualification they will automatically be enrolled into year 13 courses. Students achieving a grade U will not be able to continue to A2.

Can my child resit exams?

Examinations taken at the end of year 12 can be resat once (in most cases). Examinations only take place in May and June; therefore, any resit examinations will need to be taken alongside their A2 examinations. Students need to carefully consider how they will manage the impact this might have on preparation and revision.

My child did not achieve a grade C in GCSE English language or GCSE maths, can they resit these exams?

Yes, we encourage all students who did not achieve a grade C or above in English language and/or maths to resit these exams as it is a requirement for most universities and apprenticeships. Students can enter for these exams in November or May of year 12 or 13.

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Whilst we are unable to offer discrete lessons to those resitting these exams, students are invited to join year 11 classes where they have availability on their timetable and after school revision sessions. They should contact Mr Jones for English or Mr Jeffrey for maths to make these arrangements.

All exam resits are available to book through Mrs Bowdler, Data Manager, located at the front of school.

What does NEA mean?

NEA stands for Non-Examined Assessment and is more colloquially known as coursework. These units do not have an examination, but students must work diligently through the work, as guided by their teacher, to gain top marks.

What is UCAS?

UCAS stands for University and Colleges Admissions Service, it is the only way to apply to study at university in the UK.

Will you use AS grades to determine predicted grades for UCAS applications?

Yes, the AS qualification counts 40% towards your child's overall A level qualification and will therefore be used, alongside further assessments, to generate your child's predicted grade. UCAS requires us as a school to give a predicted grade for each of your child's subjects. Your child's predicted grade will impact which universities and courses they can apply to.

Exam Grading

Each A level qualification is out of a total of 500 or 600 UMS points.

UMS stands for Uniform Mark Scale and is awarded in each unit of the AS/A level. Each subject and qualification will apportion a different quantity of total UMS points to each unit, these can be seen on the latter pages.

When your child sits an exam, or completes an NEA, they will achieve a 'raw score' which is the number of marks they were awarded in that unit of work. WJEC will then statistically scale this raw mark into UMS points to determine the grade your child has achieved. These conversions can be accessed here: <https://www.wjecservices.co.uk/MarkToUMS/>

To achieve an A* grade at A level students must:

- Achieve a grade A overall with UMS points e.g., in a 500 UMS subject they must have achieved a minimum total of 400 UMS points across all of their AS and A2 exams.
- **And**, achieve an average of 90% **UMS** points in their A2 units.

Aspirational target grades and 'super six' support

At Hawarden we use software called Alps to help us set aspirational target grades for your child which will be shared with you on their grade card. Please see the example below.

Alps uses your child's average GCSE grade, coupled with sophisticated statistical analysis of individual subject performance across the UK, to determine an aspirational yet achievable target grade.

Subject teachers will regularly review your child's performance in assessments, alongside softer data such as performance in lessons, to give you an indication of the grade they feel your child is currently working towards **at the end of the full A level**. As mentioned previously this will be communicated to you in the grade cards.

Subject teachers will then compare your child's working towards grade to their aspirational grade and, where necessary, invite them to take part in our 'super six' scheme. If your child is chosen for the super six scheme the teacher will provide them with additional resources and support to facilitate your child improving their working towards grade.

As a sixth form team we also review grade cards and Alps data. If we feel your child is not making adequate progress across several subjects, or their attitude to learning is below our expectation across several subjects we will invite them to participate in coaching sessions during form time. The aim of this is to identify barriers to progress and help your child to identify what choices they can make to improve their outcomes.

Year 12 Timeline

<p><u>September</u> Students start sixth form and settle into their new routines. Usually, students will do any necessary swap-and-drop of subjects and settle on their final A level subject choices.</p>
<p><u>October</u> Information evening for parents to discuss all aspect of A level studies, how they can support their child to be successful and an opportunity to ask any questions.</p>
<p><u>October 27th</u> First grade card is issued and sent to parents containing your child's performance across all their subjects. Subject teachers will use these assessments to identify their 'super six'.</p>
<p><u>November 24th</u> Visit to Bangor University for a 'day in the life of a student' experience. Students will be introduced to higher education, the pros and cons, the cost involved and what student life is like. In the afternoon students will be able to attend a lecture in one of the four areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sciences/medical/biomed • Law • Business and finance • Social sciences (psychology/sociology)
<p><u>December 11th – 19th Trial examination period</u> Students will complete trial exams set by their subject teachers during this period. Their performance in these exams do not contribute to their overall qualification but do provide a strong indication of progress made and areas that need to be addressed. Subject teachers will use these trial examinations to identify their 'super six' and begin addressing gaps in knowledge and understanding.</p>
<p><u>February 21st</u> Narrative report and latest grade card issued.</p>
<p><u>February 22nd</u> Year 12 parents' evening. You will be emailed in advance to book slots to speak to your child's subject teachers and discuss the report, trial exam results, progress made and areas to work on.</p>
<p><u>March 18th – 22nd Trial examination period</u> This will be an additional opportunity for your child to rehearse for the real exam in a couple of months. Teachers will be able to identify final areas of strength and weakness and address these. It is important you child seizes this opportunity by revising thoroughly and preparing as though it was the real exam.</p>
<p><u>May 2nd</u> Final grade card issued ahead of external examinations.</p>
<p><u>May 13th – May 24th</u> These are the provisional dates given by WJEC for the AS examinations, the timetable can be accessed here: https://www.wjec.co.uk/media/xcnagfkm/summer-2024-wales-and-eduqas-as-a-level-final-timetable-22-06-23.pdf</p>

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<p><u>June 3rd</u> Return to school to commence A2 studies and begin planning UCAS and apprenticeship applications.</p>
<p><u>June 12th</u> UCAS and apprenticeship information evening for parents, details to be sent out closer to the time.</p>
<p><u>June 28th</u> Final day for year 12 in school.</p>
<p><u>July 1st – 5th</u> Work experience week. We encourage students to find a placement in an industry they wish to join as an adult. The work experience will give them valuable insight into the role and responsibility whilst also giving them the opportunity to reflect on their experience during UCAS/apprenticeship applications.</p>
